

## **COMMITTEES OF BEL MARE**

#### Finance Committee Report, submitted by Morris Bencini

First.... Bel Mare made it through Hurricane Ian relatively unscathed. While we had several palm fronds blown down, a lanai pane of glass and several fan blades blown off, we were VERY fortunate that the brunt of the storm passed us to the south and east. Our total damages were very minimal, and we did not have to file an insurance claim. We would like to thank the staff for getting the grounds buttoned-down and helping to avoid any additional damage that could have resulted from the high winds.

Through October 31st, we are approx. \$6,000 behind on our P&L budget due to several minor variances. Overall, we have tracked close to budget with just a few minor variances for the year.

The painting and water-proofing project was completed ahead of schedule and under budget. The final positive variance for the painting contract totaled approximately \$160,000 and resulted from the better-than-expected condition of the stucco and concrete leading to less repair work. This was offset by the remediation of lanai tiles in nine units that totaled almost \$140,000.

The final budget for 2023 was approved with a resulting increase of quarterly dues to \$4,100. This is almost totally due to two significant items:

- 1. The insurance renewal for 2022-23 has resulted in an additional 19% increase in premiums. This equates to \$71,000 in the insurance budget for 2023.
- 2. The reserve study completed in June 2022 resulted in a \$267,000 annual increase in reserve funding due to inflationary cost increases, the required change to full roof replacements in 2026 (rather than a liner), and the addition of the cost of lanai tile replacements in the next 10 years due to degradation of the membrane liners.

These two items represent \$338,000 of the total \$379,000 budgeted increase in expenses.

The legislature is in session and considering changes to both the state insurance programs and the impact on condo reserves due to the law passed last Spring mandating funding for certain structural components in condo reserve studies. These issues play a HUGE part in impacting our annual budget. We are closely monitoring any prospective changes and the impact they have on our future dues.

#### Maintenance Committee Report, submitted by John Ollsen

Over this past quarter the maintenance committee continued the prequalification process to secure an engineering firm capable of supporting Bel Mare's Senate Bill 4D compliance. To-date we have met with 2 engineering firms and will continue this effort into the New Year. It is understood that engineering firms capable of evaluating a facility like Bel Mare will be in short supply. A factor in finalizing our recommendation rests with clarifications to the Senate Bill itself. It is expected this will occur in the next regular legislative session in March.

The Maintenance Committee was also requested to evaluate a Building Management System referred to as Building Link. It was a unanimous decision to procure a license to use Building Link software for our building maintenance management and later for managing our Bel Mare website. The committee also completed an evaluation of the service elevator vestibule engineering report focused on controlling outside airflow via the service elevator shafts.

We are continuing our efforts to identify areas in which we can cut costs. This includes FPL energy survey, water usage, vendor contracting strategies and more. We would welcome anyone's suggestions on areas that can be evaluated for cost savings

We have had several vacancies on the Maintenance Committee and are reaching out to owners who would be interested in joining the Committee.

#### Landscape Committee Report, submitted by Gigi Stolper

The Landscape Committee wishes a very happy holiday to all our Bel Mare neighbors. We hope the festive red color of our geraniums that greet you upon entering put you in the holiday spirit!

Looking back over the year, the Committee can proudly point to over 15 successfully completed projects. Some projects are highly visible and easy to spot, like the planting of new and colorful annual beds in Spring and Fall. Other projects are not as visible to the eye, but still important to keep our beautiful palm trees and foliage happy, healthy, and sustainable. Such activities include special fertilizations, inoculations, and various treatments to prevent disease.

Of course, we always lose some plants over the natural course of time. This year, a number of them were replaced and some are still recovering from the high winds of Hurricane Ian. Last but not least, the Committee was very pleased to see newly planted Christmas Palm tree replacements in the planters on the Building 1 Amenity Deck. Please know this project is not yet complete. Plants will be added around the trees in a few months, once the palms have a chance to settle into their new "homes."

All of us on the Committee are dedicated to keeping Bel Mare beautiful. Our hard work and accomplishments would not have been successful without the enthusiastic support of our Board liaison, David Peterson and the rest of the Board members. What's more, Toni and Brian from the management team were invaluable partners and kept our vendors engaged in the landscaping projects.

We hope other neighbors will join our Committee in the new year. We welcome your ideas and participation.

#### **Birds of Bel Mare:**

#### The Feathered Torpedo by Valerie Biebuyck

Have you ever noticed something that looks like a large, grayish-brown feathered torpedo plunging from the sky into Lake Bel Mare? If you have, it likely is a Brown Pelican.

Brown Pelicans feed by diving into the water, stunning small fish with the impact of their large bodies, and scooping them up in their huge bills that are essentially expandable throat pouches. The bird catches fish underwater – along with a lot of water. When it surfaces, the pelican points its bill downward to allow the water to drain out, then tosses its head back and points the bill upward to swallow the fish.

Brown Pelicans are a familiar sight in Florida. They prefer shallow coastal waters especially on sheltered bays, but can also be seen well out to sea, and may appear on fresh water lakes inland. Bel Mare is fortunate to have attracted regular Brown Pelican visitors to its lake.

They nest in colonies on the ground, on low trees such as mangroves, or on the cliffs of islands. The male gathers material such as sticks and debris for the nest, and the female builds it. She then lays between two and four eggs that are incubated for a month by both parents. They put their webbed feet over the eggs to keep them warm. Both parents also feed the young after they have hatched. For the first ten days, they leave regurgitated food at the bottom of the nest for the newly-hatched chicks to eat. After that, the chicks eat regurgitated food directly from their parents' bills. At about five weeks, young leave the nest and gather in groups. Parents seems to be able to recognize their own offspring in these gatherings. Young can fly at around nine to twelve weeks, but it takes three to five years to fully mature.

The species was seriously endangered in the 1970s because of the pesticide endrin (which killed the birds) and DDT (which caused their eggs to have thin shells that broke under the weight of incubating parents). DDT was banned in 1972, and this helped to enable Brown Pelican populations to rebound. As they live primarily near coastal waters, Brown Pelicans remain highly susceptible to oil spills. If the birds dive through oil slicks while foraging for food, their feathers become saturated and cause them to suffer hypothermia or drown. If they can still fly, they may get poisoned by eating oil-tainted fish, or they may contaminate their nests and young. Because they take several years to mature, interruptions to their breeding and life-cycles can be devastating.

Don't confuse Brown Pelicans with White Pelicans, which also visit Bel Mare regularly! Brown Pelicans can sometimes appear white, but White Pelicans are larger and don't plunge into the water for food.

After breeding season, flocks move north along both the Atlantic and Pacific coasts, returning to warmer weather in the south by winter, like many Bel Mare residents, to share our beautiful home.
